Annual festivals and music events provide family fun

The Dance

Saturday night dances were once a part of Julian history beginning with the Gold Rush in the late 1800s, bringing the townspeople together for a long evening of music, food, and revelry. In that tradition, the Julian Sons of the American Legion will host "The Julian Dance and Back Country BBQ" now in its ninth year on **Saturday, June 13**, outdoors in a beautiful mountain setting at Menghini Winery, just two miles north of Julian at the corner of Farmer and Wynola Roads. The event starts at 2pm with three live bands, a huge dance floor, kids activities and lasts until 10pm under starlit mountain skies.
